Fort Collins-Living in the Heart of Northern Colorado

Fort Collins captures the spirit of Northern Colorado living — vibrant, outdoorsy, and deeply connected to its community. Known for its historic charm, entrepreneurial energy, and commitment to sustainability, the city offers a blend of urban sophistication and small-town warmth.

Old Town Fort Collins — The heart and soul of the city, Old Town showcases beautifully preserved Victorian homes, artisan shops, and farm-to-table restaurants. It's walkable, full of life, and home to year-round festivals and live music, appealing to those who want to be part of Fort Collins' creative pulse.

Parkwood, Indian Hills & Mission Hills — Established neighborhoods known for mature trees, spacious lots, and an enduring sense of community. Just minutes from downtown, they offer timeless architecture, quiet streets, and proximity to top-rated schools and parks.

Bucking Horse & Jessup Farm — A newer master-planned community that emphasizes lifestyle and connection. Residents enjoy walking trails, open spaces, and access to Jessup Farm Artisan Village — a vibrant mix of local dining, coffee, fitness, and boutique shops.

Rigden Farm — Ideal for those seeking a lock-and-leave lifestyle, Rigden Farm combines townhomes, condos, and patio homes with direct trail connections, nearby groceries, and easy access to the Spring Creek Trail.

Harmony Corridor (Fossil Lake Ranch, Kechter Farm, Harmony Club, Observatory Village) — This southeast corridor defines upscale living in Fort Collins. With golf courses, parks, and meticulously designed communities, the area attracts professionals and families who value open space, walkability, and premium amenities.

West Fort Collins & Foothills — Bordering Horsetooth Reservoir and Lory State Park, this area is a haven for outdoor enthusiasts. Homes range from modern builds to mountain retreats, all within minutes of hiking, biking, and panoramic views.

Rural & Equestrian (Laporte, Bellvue) — Just beyond city limits, Laporte and Bellvue offer acreage properties, mountain views, and access to the Poudre River. A perfect blend of privacy and nature, these communities are ideal for those seeking space and solitude.

Horsetooth Reservoir & Lory State Park — boating, paddleboarding, hiking, and mountain views.

Poudre River Trail — 21+ miles of multi-use trail connecting natural areas and neighborhoods.

Spring Creek Trail — east-west spine connecting Edora Park to Spring Canyon Park.

Cathy Fromme Prairie — natural area with paved and soft-surface trails; wildlife viewing.

Edora Park, Rolland Moore Park, City Park (Sheldon Lake), Fossil Creek Park, and Twin Silo Park — major community parks with courts, fields, and playgrounds.



Dog Parks & Off-Leash Areas

Spring Canyon Dog Park—Located at 2626 W. Horsetooth Road, this expansive 2–3-acre off-leash area features three separate fenced zones, including a pond area and a small/shy dog section. Amenities include benches, picnic tables, water fountains, and waste stations. The park recently underwent pond improvements to enhance water quality and safety. All dogs must be licensed and vaccinated, and a maximum of three dogs per visitor is permitted.

Twin Silo Dog Park—Found within Twin Silo Park at 5480 Ziegler Road, this one-acre fenced dog park includes a dedicated area for small dogs and a water station near the gate. It's a favorite among South Fort Collins residents for its convenient location and access to nearby trails.

Soft Gold Dog Park—Located at 520 Hickory Street, Soft Gold Dog Park offers approximately one acre of fenced space for off-leash play. The park is mostly open and sunny, so visitors are encouraged to bring water during warmer months.

Fossil Creek Dog Park—Within Fossil Creek Community Park at 5821 S. Lemay Avenue, this fenced off-leash area provides separate enclosures for large and small dogs. There is a double-gated entry, water source, and waste station at the main entrance.

Woodwest Park (Dog-Friendly Area)—Situated at 618 Powderhorn Drive, this neighborhood park includes open, grassy areas frequently used for dog exercise. While not fully fenced, it's a well-known dog-friendly location for on-leash or voice-controlled dogs.

Eastside Park Dog Area—Located at 100 Locust Street, this 1.9-acre fenced space provides room to run and socialize within Fort Collins city limits.

City Park (Fort Collins)—At the corner of Sheldon Drive and City Park Drive, this historic park allows dogs in designated on-leash areas and is often used by locals as an informal gathering spot for dog owners.

Loveland-The Sweetheart City

Dog Park at Mehaffey Park—Located at 3285 W. 22nd Street, this fenced off-leash area features a crushed-stone surface to help with drainage and weed control. Shared parking with Mehaffey Park makes access easy for visitors.

Matt Haverkamp Foundation Dog Park (Kiwanis Park)—Located behind Kiwanis Park at 240 Wall Street, this two-acre fenced park includes separate small-dog sections, agility features, benches, and a water station for dogs and owners.

Dogs are allowed to swim in designated buoyed areas, and all visitors must observe leash rules on entry and exit.

Poudre Pooch Park (Eastman Park)—Located on the west side of Eastman Park, this smaller fenced area is ideal for neighborhood use. It connects directly to Windsor’s extensive trail system and offers convenient parking and waste stations.
